ID:- AYU0137) with 42 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder -regarding.

Sir/Madam,
With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 ( 48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Veenavadini Ayurved College \& Hospital Akbarpur Phase-2 Behind Kanha Kunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID:- AYU0137) inspection of your College was conducted on 22.05.2023 \& 23.05.2023 and re-visited on 19.07.2023 \& 20.07.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility for issuance of conditional permission.
3. Further, the Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM was in reccipt of complaint against your institution regarding on paper teachers who are working only on paper but physically not present in the college and regarding various discrepancies in state registration. Accordingly, the matter was placed in the $50^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 03.08.2023. Board discussed and decided to withhold the permission process till the verification of complaint.
4. Further, four faculties of your institution in the academic year 2023-24 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3(1)(f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitation dated 31/08/2021 and letter no.3/2022/MARB/General Matter dated 17/08/2022, a penalty of rupees 1 crore was imposed on your institution as four faculties namely Dr. Sunanda Uttamrao Bhoskar (AYKC02054), Dr. Roopak Swarnkar (AYPK00891), Dr. Shirure Somesh Satyanarayan (AYST01286), Dr. Rachna Jangid (AYPK00845) were proven to be physically not present but working only on paper teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023 dated 01.09.2023.
5. Further, the assessment report after reducing the aforementioned on paper teachers was placed in the $57^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 05.09.2023. On examining the case on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility for issuance of conditional permission due to following reasons-

## 1. Teaching staff (For UG):-

Hearing for verification of on paper teaching staff was conducted on 08.08 .2023 and it was found that 04 teaching staff namely Dr. Sunanda Uttamrao Bhoskar (AYKC02054), Dr. Roopak Swarnkar (AYPK00891), Dr. Shirure Somesh Satyanarayan (AYST01286), Dr. Rachna Jangid (AYPK00845) are not considered as regular
teachers in the college and same was informed to you vide ref no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2023 dated 01.09.2023.

6. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein the board decided to provide dil uppoilunity of hearing to the college. As per the direction, an opportunity of virtual hearing was given to the college vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 14.09.2023 to appear on 18.09.2023 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24. The college was directed to make written submisslon in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. VVAC/583/2023 dated 15.09.2023 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
7. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Dr, Prashant Dhakole, Principal, Dr. Manish Jain, Vice Principal and Dr. O.P Sukhla, Medical Superintendent appeared before the Hearing Committee on 18.09.2023 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Board, Bhopal (except 01 teacher) and with all supportive relevant documents. Therefore, it is requested to review the matter and add In our teaching staff list.

8. Meanwhile, a letter vide ref. no. VVAC/578/23 dated $\mathbf{1 1 . 0 9 . 2 0 2 3}$ was received from the Principal of the college requesting to allow to pay the imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 1 crore in respect of appointing faculties physically not present but working only on paper teachers in installments. Further your request was placed in the $\mathbf{5 8}^{\mathbf{t h}}$ Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM held on 14.09.2023 and Board decided to accept the request of the college to pay the imposed monetary penalty amount of Rs. 1 crore in 04 equal installments. The 1st installment of Rs. 25 lakh shall be paid immediately and remaining three (03) installments shall be paid within 04 months of 1st installment or before issuance of permission for the academic session 2024-25 and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 18.09.2023. In response of the same you have furnished the imposed penalty amount worth Rupees 25 lakh in favor of The National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine through RTGS vide UTR No. PUNBR52023092719370032 dated 27.09.2023 and informed the same vide an email dated 27.09 .2023.
9. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the $\mathbf{6 0}^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 22.09.2023.
10. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and board decided that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for Grant of Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24, but Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24.
"For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by $10 \%$ of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the $60^{\text {th }}$ Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 24 total eligible teaching faculties after reducing physically absent but present only on paper teachers and excluding excess staff.

There is deficiency of 03 teachers for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance of Seat Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by $10 \%$ of total intake capacity. Therefore, after applying the seat Reduction Policy, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 42 seats [instead of $\mathbf{6 0}$ seats] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.
11. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, Conditional Permission is issued to the Veenavadini Ayurved College \& Hospital Akbarpur Phase-2 Behind Kanha Kunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh, (Inst. ID:- AYU0137) with 42 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder for the academic session 2023-24.
(i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 \& ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
(ii) It is further informed that $15 \%$ of undergraduate of the permitted intake capacity with 42 seats [instead of 60 seats] shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining $85 \%$ seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
(iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of $50 \%$ of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining $50 \%$ of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
12. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act \& Regulations thereunder.
13. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts \& Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
14. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
15. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-2025:
(i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching \& training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
(ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
(iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
16. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
