**Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur, Phase-2, Behind Kanhakunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0137) with intake capacity of 57 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26- reg.**

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur, Phase-2, Behind Kanhakunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0137)** inspection was conducted on **17.03.2025 and 18.03.2025 on hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

**1. Teaching staffs:-**

- Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of yearly permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course after considering the teachers is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.66\%$  (Excluding Excess and visitor observation report).

**b) Shortcoming is as under:-**

- Monetary Penalty of Rs. 01 Crore was imposed on your institution for appointing teachers who were physically absent but shown present on-paper teacher in the academic year 2023-24 and in which college has paid the only first installment of Rs. 25 lakh. Further a monetary penalty of Rs. 60 Lakh (Rupees Sixty Lakh Only) was imposed for denial of access to the authorized visitors of MARBISM during the academic year 2024-25.**

- Further a clarification letter for above shortcoming and reminder letter for penalty was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated **10.07.2025.**
- In response of the same you have submitted the clarification for the observed shortcomings/defects vide an email dated 12.07.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. VVAC/855/25 dated 12.07.2025 and**

regarding remittance of remaining penalty amount you have sent an email dated 16.07.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. VVAC/857/25 dated 16.07.2025. Accordingly, the submitted clarification and the assessment report was once again carefully examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-

**1. Teaching Staff:-**

Now, the faculty is appointed as Professor in Kaumarbhritya department but his appointment cannot be considered as there is no provision of allied as per MSE 2022 and faculty is post graduate in Kayachikitsa department.

**Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course after considering the teachers is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.66\%$  (Excluding Excess and visitor observation report).**

- 5) Thereafter, the assessment report of the college for the Academic year 2025-26 along with your clarification for the shortcomings/defects observed during assessment and above requested letter regarding penalty was placed in the 136<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.07.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. Hence, board decided to issue yearly permission in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 as per seat reduction policy after remittance of remaining penalty amount and same was informed to you vide letter of even no. dated 14.08.2025.
- 6) In response of the same you have remitted the penalty amount of Rs. 25,00,000/- (Twenty Five Lakh Only) by RTGS dated 22.08.2025 from the monetary penalty amount and requested that the remaining amount will be paid after some time and informed the same vide an email dated 22.08.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. VVAC/892/2025 dated 22.08.2025.
- 7) Further, again you were directed vide letter of even no. dated 29.08.2025 to remit the penalty amount of Rs. 25 Lakh (1<sup>st</sup> installment) from Rs. 60 Lakh for declining the visitation and in response of the same you have remitted the penalty amount of Rs. 25,00,000/- (Twenty Five Lakh Only) by RTGS dated 08.09.2025 and informed the same vide email dated 08.09.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. VVAC/900/2025 dated 08.09.2025.

**a) As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-**

**"For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity".**

All the colleges shall fulfill the requirement of teaching staff as mentioned in Schedule IV of MESAR 2024 and the availability of teaching staff for 60 and 100 intake capacity shall be 100% as the provision of conditional permission mentioned in the Regulation 3(3) of MSR-2016 is not available in the MESAR-2024. However, as per the revised policy letter issued on 20.01.2025, "The 10% Relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the Academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100 intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately".

After re-verification of the assessment report, college is having only 26 total eligible Teaching faculties.

There is deficiency of 01 total teaching faculties as per the approved revised policy letter dated 20.01.2025 for issuance of yearly Permission under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26. **Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-2026, for deficiency of one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity. As there is deficiency of 01 teacher, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 03 seats).**


Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **yearly permission with intake capacity of 57 seats [instead of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

#### **"DECISION"**

- 8) **Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above after applying the Seat Reduction policy 2025-26 and as per the policy letter dated 20.01.2025 Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur, Phase-2, Behind Kanhakunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0137) in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 with intake capacity of 57 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-**
- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 57 seats (instead of 60 seats) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. **Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.**
- 9) **Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.**
- 10) **Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 11) **Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.**
- 12) **Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.**
- 13) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.**
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.**
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.**
  - The shortcoming mentioned in above Para no. 4, shall be fulfilled.**
  - The remaining visitation fee as communicated in the letter 28.01.2025.**

- 14) Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the decision of the Board as per regulation 65 of (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- 15) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
