**Subject:-Provisional conditional permission to Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur Phase-2 Behind Kanha Kunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0137) with intake capacity of 30 seats (instead of 60 seats)in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-regarding..**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur Phase-2 Behind Kanha Kunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0137)** inspection of your College was conducted on **05.02.2024 and 06.02.2024 and re-visited on 18.03.2024 and 19.03.2024 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **Conditional permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
2. However, you have denied to conduct the re-visitation and Medical Assessment & Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine was in a receipt of a letter **vide ref. no. VVAC/228/24 dated 18.03.2024** wherein you have informed that **"due to condolence holiday declared on the today (18.03.2024) morning by the college administration mentioning that emergency services will be continue as usual in the hospital, because of respected father of Dr. Narayan Ahirwar, Lect- Samhita & Siddhant suddenly expired yesterday on 17.03.2024"**.
3. In view of above, an opportunity of virtual hearing was provided to you vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 06.05.2024 and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 89<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 10.05.2024 and Board decided to issue Denial of Conditional Permission for the academic session 2024-25 and accordingly denial of conditional permission was issued to you vide letter of even no. 11.06.2024.**
4. Further, aggrieved by the said order dated **11.06.2024** you approached before the Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Jabalpur and filed writ petition no. **26152 of 2024** and Hon'ble High court vide its order dated 17.10.2024 disposed of the writ petition no. **26152 of 2024** and held as under:-

**"without getting into the said controversy since admittedly the college was not inspected the second time, we direct the national commission for Indian system of medicine to carry out an inspection of the subject college and thereafter, take an appropriate decision based on the said inspection in terms of the standard Operating Procedures"**.

5. Accordingly, in compliance of the Hon'ble High Court order your college was again visited on 28.10.2024 and 29.10.2024. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were again assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcoming/defect have been observed:-**

1) **Teaching staffs:-**

i. Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course according to part 1 submitted by the college is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{25}{30} \times 100\% = 83.3\%$  (Excluding Excess).

ii. Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course according to teachers mentioned by the visitors is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.66\%$  (Excluding Excess and including visitor observation report).

2) **Functionality of the hospital:-**

- Labour room is non functional.
- Panchakarma block is non functional.

3) **Observation by the visitors:-**

- Hospital Pharmacy doesn't have proper Registers and other invoice documents.
- Computerized central registration of OPD system is not found.
- IPD patients were very less as only 5 patients were seen in the male ward.
- Stock registers, indent register and computer were not found in any OPD.
- Unhygienic conditions and poor ventilation were found in casualty, Prasuti, Shalya major and minor OT.
- Case sheets and documents were not maintained properly.
- Major OT and Labour room were not satisfactorily seen functioning due to the unhygienic condition and shortage of instruments, functionality of Panchakarma unit and kriya kalpa units not maintained properly.
- X-Ray room, dark room and pathological lab are not maintained properly.
- Shalakyia Operation Theater is not functional.
- The dissection hall doesn't have SS dissecting tables two dead bodies were stored along with some models and specimens at the anatomy department.
- Physiology and Pathology department are not maintained as per the norms of MSR.
- The hostels are not suitable for students due to unhygienic condition. Common rooms for boys and Girls were not there in collage.
- At Present Final year BAMS batch was not present.
- Timings of the college are from 11am to 5 pm, which is not as per the norms of MSR and by which staff can't complete the prescribed syllabus.
- X-ray machine was not working.

6. Whereas, in view of the aforementioned shortcoming and deficiencies it is found that the **college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020, as per regulation 3(3) of MSR-2016. However, looking for the urgency involved in the matter, owing to the on going admission process it has been decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the academic session 2024-25.**

**As per the seat reduction policy:-**

**a) For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity."**

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. Accordingly the college is having only 26 total eligible Teaching faculties.

There is deficiency of 01 teacher for issuance of conditional Permission for academic session 2024-25 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2024-25, for deficiency of one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity.**

**Further, in accordance of Seat Reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing six seats of the total intake capacity.**

**"In case of non-availability of any teaching staff in the department (vacant department) for intake capacity upto 60 seats, seat reduction policy shall be applied considering the deficiency of one (01) teacher for 60 seats intake capacity in each of the vacant department."**

In the department of Kaumarbhritya no faculty is available therefore seat reduction policy shall be applied considering the deficiency of **one (01) teacher** in Kaumarbhritya department. **Accordingly, as per the Seat reduction Policy the seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity.**

**Therefore, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing twelve seats of the total intake capacity.**

**b) In case of deficiency in Functionality of Hospital seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 30% of total intake capacity."**

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy **seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing 18 seats of the total intake capacity.**

Accordingly after applying the seat Reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **provisional conditional permission with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats)** in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

The seat reduction is subject to the outcome of the hearing to be conducted as a measure of natural justice which could not be conducted due to the urgency of the matter.

7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, provisional conditional permission is granted to **Veenavadini Ayurved College & Hospital, Akbarpur Phase-2 Behind Kanha Kunj, Kolar Road, Bhopal-462042, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0137) with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under subject to the condition that the college shall fulfill the following requirements:-**

- I. The provisional conditional permission issued is subject to the imposition of monetary penalty with respect to the denial of access to the authorized visitors of MARBISM, and verification of availability of minimum essential standards as per rules. As per the order of high court in WP. No 26152 of 2024 it is open to the petitioner to accept the same without prejudice to the rights and contention of the parties.
- II. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- III. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 30 seats (instead of 60 seats)** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- IV. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

11. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2025-26:-**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
13. The decision is subject to the ratification in the ensuing board meeting.
